MUDGE ISLAND SAFETY TIPS



WHAT ARE THESE TIPS FOR?

MICS has put together this tip sheet to help you stay safe while enjoying our island paradise. Outdoor fires can quickly escalate into something more serious and become a dangerous wildfire. Additionally, anyone needing serious medical attention will have to be taken off island by boat or airlift, requiring vital extra minutes.

Please keep safe, burn safely and enjoy all Mudge Island has to offer.



WHAT IS MICS?

Mudge Island Citizens Society (MICS) is a non-profit Society whose purpose is to provide support for fire prevention, firefighting equipment and emergency services on Mudge Island. Mudge Island is classified as an unprotected area.

What MICS is not?

- MICS is NOT a recognized volunteer fire department
- Every effort will be made to contain a wildfire but there are limits
- We do not have the equipment or training to safely deal with building fires, but will work to prevent a building fire from spreading.



HOW IS MICS FUNDED?

Here are steps you should take:

- Keep it far away from anything burnable
- 2. Don't burn in high winds
- 3. Have water on hand to control it (even seawater)
- 4. Use long-handled tools to manage the fire
- 5. Stay with your fire until out
- 6. Douse well if leaving your fire
- 7. Know that fire can travel underground and reignite
- 8. Learn about the current allowable fire size

WHO DO I CALL IN AN EMERGENCY?

An emergency can be a fire, accident or serious medical situation. Having one? Call! See one? Call!

Get immediate help here:

- Post a message on MICS WhatsApp Emergency Call Out List**

**To enlist on WhatsApp MICS channel: Add Philip Parsons 250.818.2879, or Dale Erickson 250.755.9994 to your phone's contacts. Open WhatsApp and send one of them a message asking to be included on the MICS Emergency call out list. Include your full name and cell number. Volunteers will respond to posted emergencies.



WHAT DOES SHUTDOWN MEAN?

- Shutdowns mean stopping certain high-risk activities at 1pm (known as "early shift") or all day (known as "total shutdown")
- Shutdowns usually happen during hot, dry periods
- Shutdown notices usually comes out on the Mudge email list (see below)
